Benes Family History

The Benes family can be traced back to Czechoslovakia, and there is a long history to the Benes name.. Ermin and Dolores (Potter) Benes were married on June 24, 1947. The senior Beneses now have 31 grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren.

The home site of Benes Cattle Company can be traced back to when it was called the Forman Ranch, which consisted of 16 sections of land. The Benes farming operation consists of corn, soy beans, and alfalfa in a rotation program. Benes Cattle Company has been

innovative in the area of cattle ranching for over 50 years, being one of the first to introduce Charolais cattle to the area. They have been actively involved in raising purebred cattle, running a seed stock business and selling polled Charolais bulls and polled Black ½ Simmental ½ Angus bulls to commercial producers.

Ermin is also a past member of the Board of Directors for the Nebraska Cattlemen, past president of the Saunders County Livestock Association for 12 years, and now sits on the board. Together Ermin and Dolores Benes and their family have built a legacy to pass on to their children and future generations.

Tribute to Melvin Benes


Melvin Benes—Son, brother, husband, father, grand-father, uncle, and friend; though with us a short time, touched the lives of so many people.

Melvin was born the sixth child of Ermin and Dolores Benes, on February 25, 1958. Melvin lived with his parents, farming and ranching, until his marriage to Lona Skoda on August 21, 1976. Melvin and Lona lived on a farm north of Valparaiso where they raised their five children Melissa, Mitch, Lee and twin boys Martin and Matthew.

Melvin loved the cattle business and took pride in the development of his purebred Charolais herd. He became very active in the Nebraska Junior Charolais Association, and later on the Senior Charolais Association and was an active 4-H leader. Teaching his children the cattle business was a very high goal in his life. For his lifelong belief and support of the Charolais breed, he was the 1996 Junior National Show Dedicatee.

Melvin died on October 16, 1994. He was struck with an aneurysm in the pasture while checking cows, doing what he loved best.

Melvin, at the time of his death, was able to donate many organs to help others maintain a happy life with

their families. Seven successful transplants were completed. Melvin lives on in the heart, kidney, eyes, bone marrow and liver that sustain life for another person, and in the hearts and memories of all that knew and loved him.

Hero's Wall - Serenity Park

Here is a place for quiet contemplation, remembering those who have fought the war against cancer. Located just as you enter the Ball area (Area K), you will be greeted by a beautiful spot of flowers and rocks, benches, flags of all the cattlemen's ranches, and our 2002 Cattlemen's Ball flag pole. Centered here is the Hero's Wall, which is new this year, and which is the start of an ongoing tradition of the Ball:

A wall on which you may write the name of your loved one, place a picture of your friend or family member you want to remember and have remembered. Markers are available to write the name on the wall, and place a picture. The wall will be placed with all the Ball materials, to be passed on to each succeeding Ball, making a living history of those who have had cancer.

UNIC EPPLEY Cancer Center

Unfortunately, cancer is a disease that does not discriminate. It impacts men, women and children. Whether it has reached a friend, a family member, a neighbor or themselves, most Nebraskans have been touched by cancer.

More than 7,300 new cases of cancer will be diagnosed in Nebraska in 2002 alone. Because of these large num-

bers and the statistics, Nebraskans must take a more active role in working toward better diagnosis, treatment and prevention of these diseases.

As a leader in cancer research and cancer care for more than 30 years, the UNMC Eppley Cancer Center combines patient care, biomedical research and education programs for cancer patients, their families and the public.

The UNMC Eppley Cancer Center is both nationally and internationally recognized as a National Cancer Institute designated clinical cancer center — one of only 12 NCI-designated clinical cancer centers in the country. In fact, people from all 50 states and 19 foreign countries have come to our cancer center in search of treatment and hope.

Fund raising events such as the Cattlemen's Ball are very important in our quest for information about the puzzling diseases of cancer.

PSA Test & Sunscanner Test


Stop by the UNC Eppley Center booth, located in Tent F, for a free Prostate Specific Antigen (PSA) test. This test includes a blood draw and is a valuable tool in the detection of prostate cancer. Results are, of course, confidential and will be mailed out following the Cattlemen's Ball. And, for you sun worshippers, there is a cancer risk evaluation questionnaire and a sunscanner test available, which shows sun damage and problem areas on the face.

The "Cattlemen's Cancer Research Grant" allows young investigators to pursue new, innovative ideas. It also allows

established scientists to change directions in their research to pursue fresh, less-traveled avenues of investigation. Al though beginning new research costs a great deal of money

it is often the new, innovative ideas tha lead to important breakthroughs in can cer research. It is obvious that these nev research projects are fundamental in reaching our goals in the war against can cer.

Last year's ball raised \$130,000 for can cer research at the UNMC Eppley Cance Center. These monies are being used t support multi-investigator translational re search programs. We asked our investigators to form collaborations of basic an clinical scientists and develop a researc program that would address importar problems in specific cancers includin breast cancer, prostate cancer, lymphom and leukemia. Through these collaborative research programs we hope to ider tify new treatments for those diseases.



Nebraskans should be proud of the research being don at the UNMC Eppley Cancer Center. While tremendou progress has been made in our fight against cancer, then is much work yet to be done. In order to ensure our success in battling these diseases in the future everyone mu help in funding research. People can do so by participa ing in important events such as the Cattlemen's Ball a even by making personal donations to the cancer center.

There has been significant progress in the war on cance We must continue our fight against these deadly diseasuntil they are no longer a major threat to the health Nebraskans.

Shuttle Service: Catch a free ride to and from the parking lot on one of the wagons travelling between the lot and the activities.

Beef Can Meat the Challenge

The Beef Can Meat the Challenge display is designed to give Cattlemen's Ball participants an opportunity to increase awareness of the production practices used to grow beef animals to produce a wholesome product that can be purchased and consumed without concern.

You have publications and scare tactics used which try to discourage consumers from eating beef. These tactics include health and environmental concerns which, after thorough examination of all the facts, are shown to be just that—scare tactics.

What are the facts?

- Beef provides 39% of the daily value of zinc, chicken provides just 6%. Zinc keeps you going strong by helping maintain a healthy immune system. Seventy-five percent of children ages three to five do not meet their needs for zinc.
- Beef is one of the best sources of iron. Close to 40% of Americans don't meet their daily iron requirements.
- Nearly half the fat in beef is monounsaturated, the same heart-healthy fat found in olive oil.
- Beef is considered a "complete protein" because it contains all the essential amino acids the human body needs. Today's beef has 27% less fat than ten years ago.
- There are 23,800 beef cow operations in the state with an average herd size of 82 head.

There are 5700 cattle feeding operations statewide and only 781 of these are larger than 500 head.

 Cattle turn grass and rough forage into a protein and many other products. The land grazed by cattle allows more people access to a high protein diet than would otherwise be possible.

Nebraska's beef industry represents a major share of activity in the state's economy. In terms of gross receipts, cattle marketing contributes \$4.6 billion to the pockets of Nebraska farmers and ranchers. Add the meat processing centers and those 99,400 jobs and you have an additional \$4.8 billion of personal income generated by the beef industry. With the purchased supplies and services used by producers and the value added products from beef, the industry has an \$11.5 billion impact to the Nebraska economy.

Cattle outnumber people in this state by nearly four to one. Why are there so many cows in Nebraska? Grass, corn and water are the reasons. Nebraska has 25 million acres of range land and pasture. In the western half of the state, this land, without center pivot irrigation, really can't grow anything but grass.

Walk through the **Beef Can Meat the Challenge** display in Area E and talk to the experts about beef production. They can answer your questions about beef from conception to consumption. You will come away with a newfound knowledge and will be convinced that beef is a product which is produced in a humane manner and that is wholesome, nutritious and delicious.





Akins is spokesman for Boys and Girls Clubs of America.


Daryle Singletary
