NIEWOHNER FAMILY HISTORY

The Delbert Niewohner family story is one of hard work and family pride.

Delbert's father, Herman Niewohner, came to America with his father and family of three sisters from Germany, at the age of nine. He arrived by boat and landed on Ellis Island, September 1906. Herman married Hannah Werner of Battle Creek, NE in 1924 in Norfolk, NE. They had four children, Dorothy, Delbert, Marion, and Jo Ann.

Delbert grew up farming and growing livestock with his father near Norfolk, NE. His first loss in farming was with a FFA calf. The calf was being fed with his dad's herd of 50 cattle. The cattle were eating around a straw pile when it fell over trapping 6 head underneath. One of those was Delbert's FFA calf! Delbert graduated from Norfolk High in 1946. Well known personality, Johnny Carson, was 2 years ahead of him in high school.

Delbert bought his first farm at Albion, NE in 1948, while still living in Norfolk. In 1950, he was drafted into the Army and served in Korea from 1950 to 1952. On December 26, 1953, he married Marilee Gallion. She was a school teacher in the Norfolk School System. Marilee was born and raised in Chester, NE, where six-man football was first implemented. In the spring of 1954, Delbert and Marilee moved to a farm six miles north of Albion. Their house had no running water, bathroom, or telephone. In 1956, they started their family of five children; one daughter, Linda, and four sons; Jerry, Steven, Mark, and Matthew. All of the children are currently involved in the family operation. Delbert and Marilee have also been blessed with 18 grandchildren. Of these, Craig, Lisa and her husband Jack, and Sarah and her husband Dana have also joined in the farming and feeding operation. The older grandchildren; Julie, Kristy, Justin, Philip, Drew, Nathan, Derek, Jerad, and Emily, have also worked during the summer months at the feedlots. The younger grandchildren; Logan, Hayden, Noah, and Garret, will soon join in.

Delbert and his four sons have been farming and feeding cattle together since the boys were quite young. Delbert has been asked more than once how he got all four boys to come back to the farm. He tells them "you have to let them be an owner and not just an employee". In the early years, Marilee cooked meals for the employees along with raising their family. The tradition and convenience has continued through today. At the Albion and Spalding feedlots, lunches are prepared for the employees daily. During harvest, lunches are sent in to-go boxes for the employees and offered to any area farmers bringing corn.

Delbert and his sons fed their first cattle north of Albion. In 1979, Delberts sons bought their own feedlot at Elgin, NE. Steven manages the Elgin feedlot. Mark manages the Albion feedlot. Jerry is in charge of selling the cattle and oversees business matters in addition to going to cattle sales almost every day. Matthew is in charge of the farming operation. Linda, and her husband Dave, moved back to Albion in 2005 from O'Neill, NE after Dave retired as a State Patrolman. Linda works in the Albion office as a Secretary. Steven's wife, Jane, is a secretary in the Elgin office. The other daughters-in-law; Karen (Jerry's wife), Jana (Mark's wife), and Tiffany (Matthew's wife) have all helped out in the operation when needed.

Delbert turned the business over to his sons when he turned 62. He spends his retirement going to cattle sales about every day!

Since starting out in Albion, Delbert and his sons, have bought and built onto feedlots in Albion, Elgin, and Spalding. They have a large farming operation to produce feed for the three locations. It has grown to a size that now employs approximately 100 employees to help take care of the operations. In the fall, they rely on 10 to 15 backgrounder yards to help with the fall calf runs.

The Niewohner family appreciates the opportunity to host the Cattlemen's Ball to raise money for cancer research. Delbert and Marilee have had several family members lose their fight against cancer. Jerry, their eldest son, survived cancer about 8 years ago. Their son-in-law, Dave Spiegel, had successful prostate cancer surgery a few months ago.

Michael Brattain, Ph.D. joined the UNMC Eppley Cancer Center as the Associate Director for Basic Research in June of 2007. As the Associate Director for Basic Research, Dr. Brattain oversees all basic science research initiatives at the Cancer Center. He currently has four grants from the National Cancer Institute (NCI), three of which have been continuously funded for more than twenty years, and fosters new multidisciplinary research in the Cancer Center. His own research program focuses on the development of new therapies for colon and breast cancer. Dr. Brattain has published nearly 200 journal articles in medical publications such as Cancer Research, Oncogene, Journal of Biochemistry, Molecular and Cellular Biology, and Science, and has received numerous awards for his research.

Dr. Brattain earned his doctoral degree in biochemistry from Rutgers University in New Jersey. He served as a senior scientist at Bristol-Myers Company and held full professor faculty appointments at the Medical College of Ohio and the University of Texas Health Science Center in San Antonio. Prior to joining the Eppley Cancer Center, he was the Senior Vice-President for Basic Research at Roswell Park Cancer Institute in Buffalo, New York.



Diamond Rio is, in effect, a family-friendly group of guys with a trailblazing-rock-band mentality.


