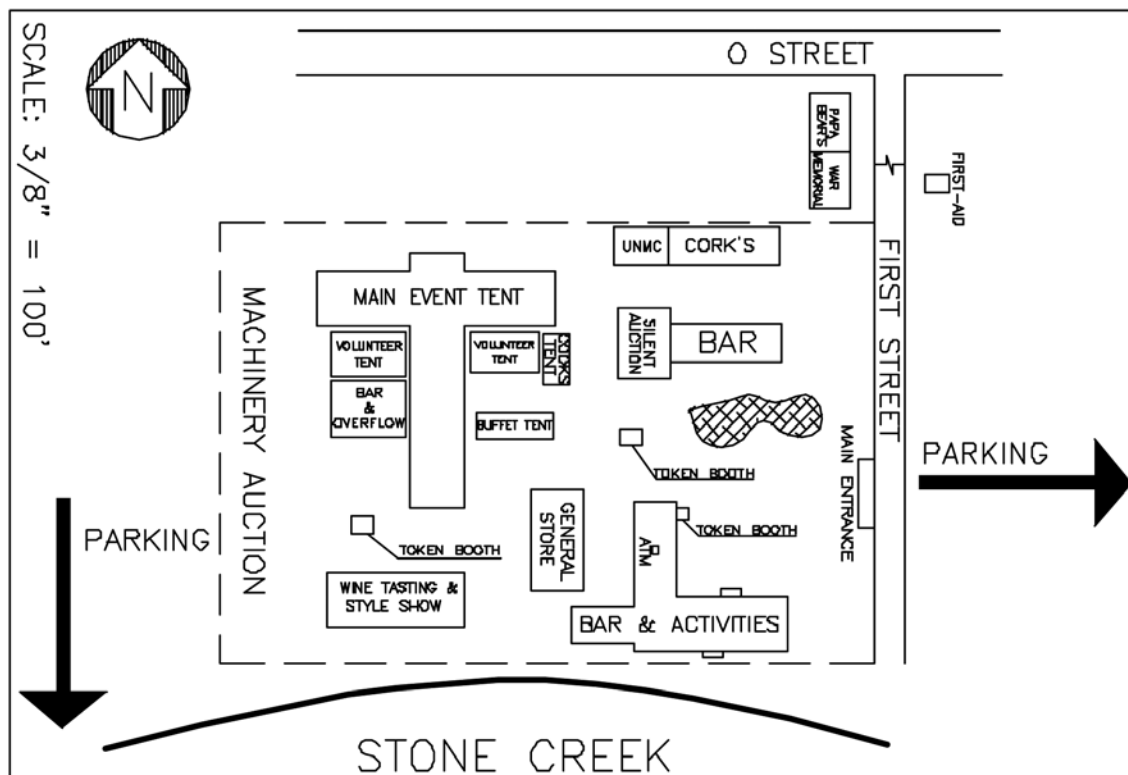

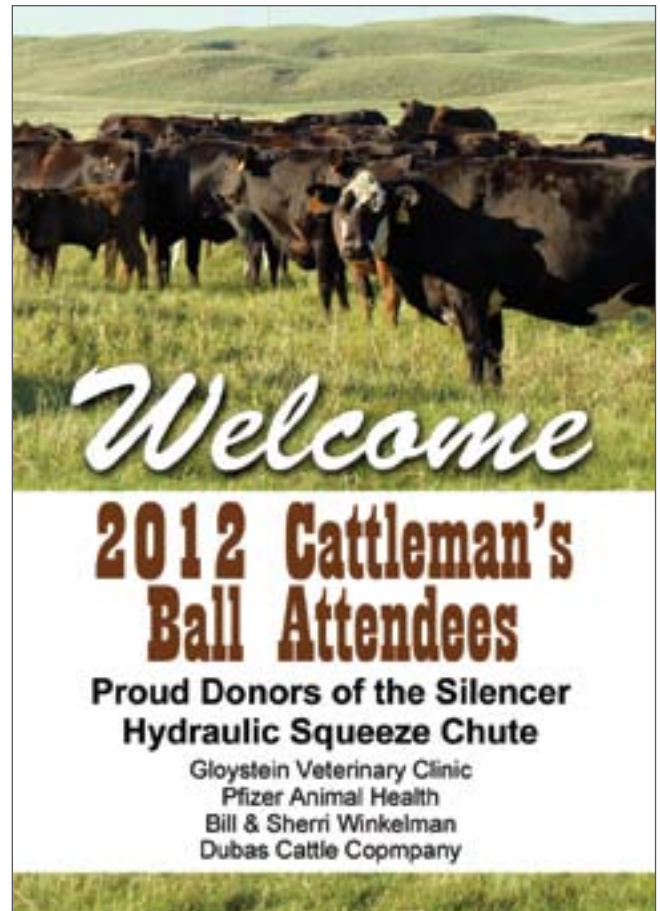

## HOST FAMILY

The Allen and Shelly Clark family of McCool Junction are very proud and excited to host the 2012 Cattlemen's Ball of Nebraska, Friday-Saturday, June 1-2, 2012.

The Clark family has been in the farming and livestock business for four generations in McCool Junction. Originally, the Clark operation was diversified. By the time Allen's generation came along, each of his siblings had picked a part of the operation they liked best and expanded it. The oldest and youngest of the children took over the swine operation, another brother concentrates on row crops, and Allen started in the cattle feeding business in the mid-70's along with his parents, Maurice and Regina, as Clark Feedlots. In 1998 Allen and Shelly took sole ownership and renamed the business A.C. Feed Yards. In 2005, the couple started a new business, Stone Creek Event Center—the location for this year's Cattlemen's Ball.

Today, A. C. Feed Yards consists of Allen, their daughter Melissa, and hired help to do the day-to-day

work. In addition to the cattle, the Clark's farm corn, soybeans, and hay. Shelly runs the event center—a successful business that is totally booked for 2012—and keeps books for the feedlot. The Clark's are looking forward to having all five of their children home for the event: Melanie will be back from a cardiology cath lab contract at Stanford University with some friends in tow; Eric will be home from seminary school in Maryland; Andrew will be taking a break as an aircraft maintenance manager at Andrews Air Force Base in Washington, D. C.; and Alex will be home from studying ag business at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln.

Like many families, the Clarks have been touched by cancer. "Allen's mother passed away from colon cancer and my father, Larry Conroy, died of lung cancer," Shelly says, so hosting the 2012 Cattlemen's Ball has special meaning and importance to them. "We look forward to hosting this amazing event and welcome everyone to McCool Junction to 'Send Cancer Up the Creek Without a Paddle.'"

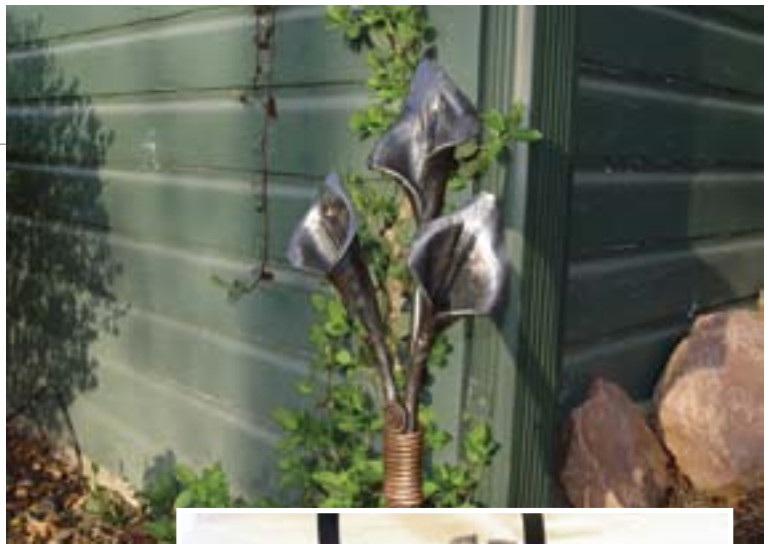


