Complimentary Shuttle

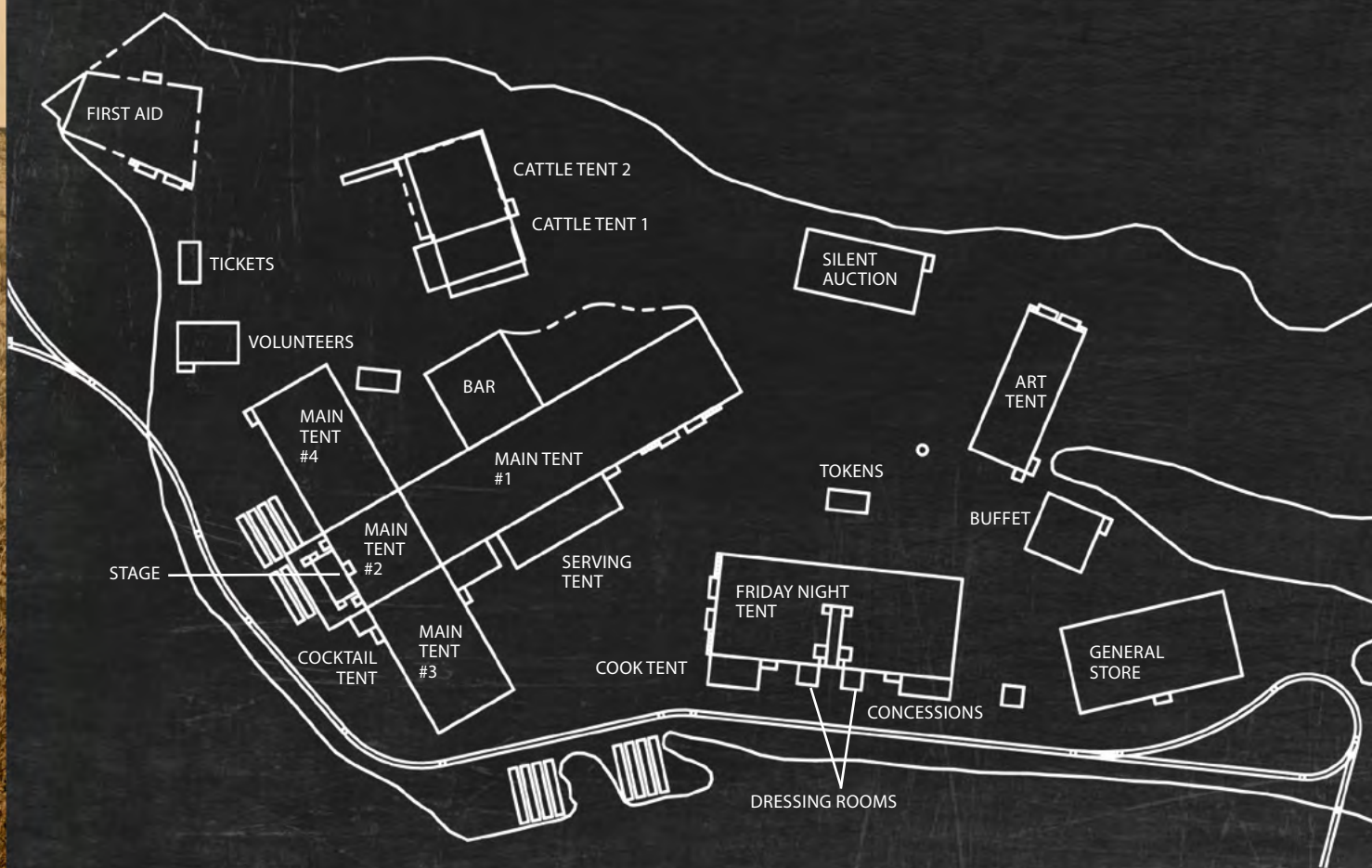

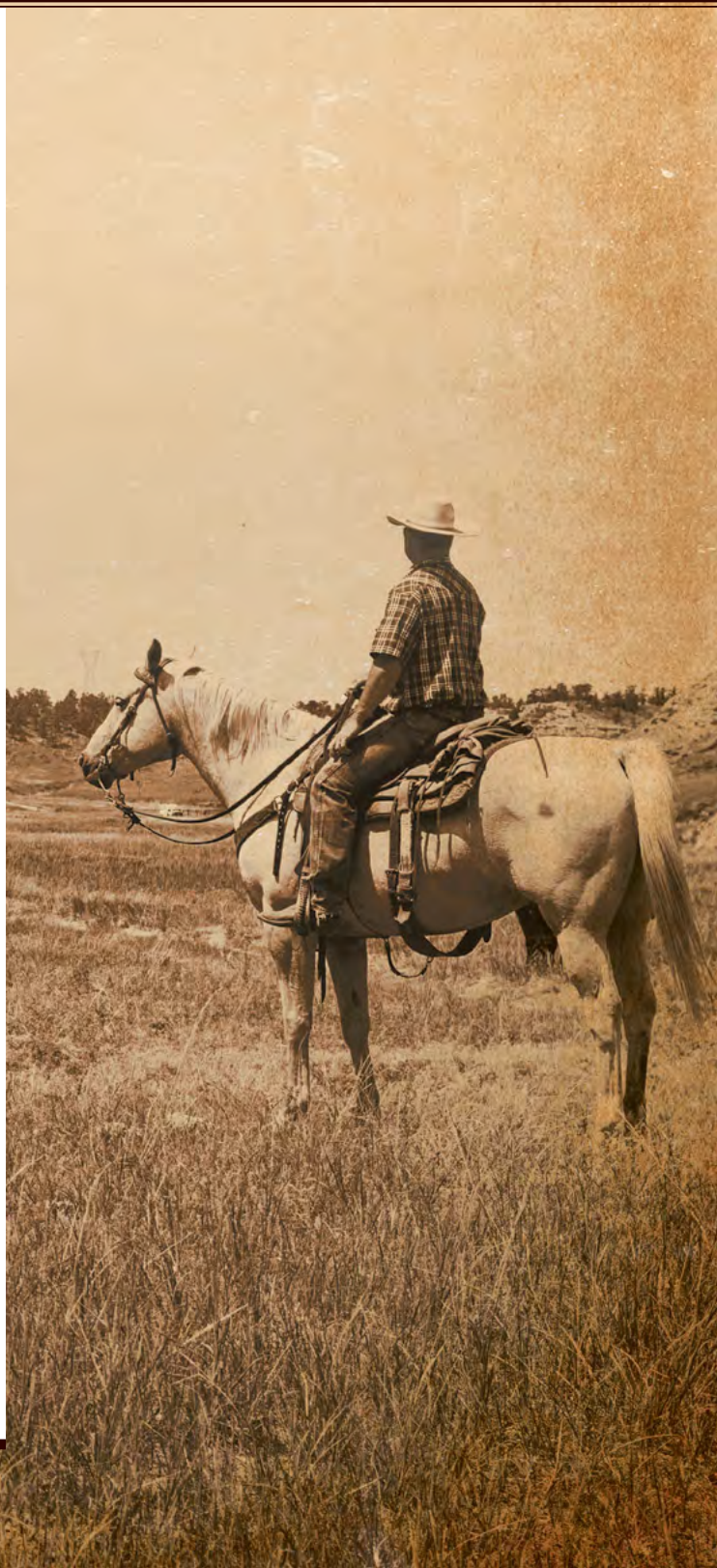

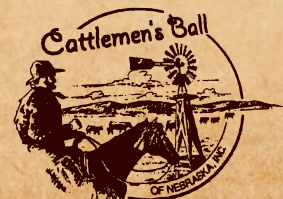

Crockpot Pot Roast

Misty Stauffer Shares Her Family's Favorite Beef Recipe





It's Not Your Grandma's Roast!

"When Kenny and I got married 16 years ago, there was no way I would have ever dreamed that roast would be our family's favorite meal. As a young girl, I went over to my grandparents' house every Sunday after church for lunch. Almost every Sunday, my grandpa would make orange rolls, potatoes, carrots, and gravy, and my grandma would make roast. Now, I'm telling you, the gravy was the best part because she always overcooked the roast in the oven. If you've ever cooked a roast in the oven you know that it loses its juices and wonderful flavor and ends up very dry. After about two years of marriage, I finally gave in and cooked a roast in the crockpot and it became our favorite meal! You can't beat a roast and potatoes. So here's my version of roast, served three ways—I guarantee it's not your grandma's roast!" —Misty Stauffer

Crockpot Pot Roast

1 (4-pound) roast (We love chuck and pikes peak.)

1 box beef broth (once emptied, fill with water)

2 tablespoons minced garlic

Salt and pepper

1 whole white onion, quartered

Combine all ingredients in a crockpot set to high. (If your roast is frozen, cook for 8 hours; if your roast thawed, cook for 5 hours.) When it's ready, the beef will literally fall apart. You won't have to do anything except use a fork to shred it before serving.

I usually cook the roast overnight if I need to use it for a crew of hungry guys at lunch time. Here are two ways I serve the roast for lunch.

BBQ Beef Sandwiches

BBQ sauce

2 cups ketchup

1 cup brown sugar

3 tablespoons liquid smoke

2 tablespoons garlic powder

2 tablespoons chili powder

Salt and pepper

Cumin and cayenne pepper to taste

Shred the roast after it's been cooked. Return to the crockpot and add BBQ Sauce ingredients. Serve on a Kaiser bun.

Shredded Beef Tacos

Shred the roast after it's been cooked, add taco seasoning, and return to crockpot.

Serve shredded beef in tortillas and top with lettuce, shredded cheese, guacamole, and salsa.

So, if you haven't already, check out some of the most popular lean beef cuts like strip steak, T-Bone, and tenderloin steak. You're probably already cooking a lean cut at home or choosing it when dining out!

"Dr. Arthur Beaudet, Professor and Chair of Molecular and Human Genetics at the Baylor College of Medicine, told me on Rural Route Radio that red meat consumption will reduce the rate of autism. The reason is that red meat is such a good source of carnitine.

Meat eaters receive about 75 percent of their carnitine requirement from their diet. However, dietary carnitine levels are low in vegetarians and particularly in vegans. In most people, levels of carnitine are balanced by the body's ability to manufacture its own carnitine in the liver, kidney, and brain, starting with a modified form of the amino acid lysine.

A 1998 study, published in the *Archives of Pediatrics & Adolescent Medicine*, showed that children who ate breakfast regularly had higher reading and math scores, lower levels of depression, anxiety, and hyperactivity, better school attendance, improved attention spans, and fewer behavior problems."

Beef sells for about \$1.15 per serving. That's a lot of satisfying nutrients for your dollar.

2 Buy in bulk.
You can divide bulk quantities can save you a dollar or two per pound. Freeze portioned steaks individually, or serve when entertaining a group.

3 Go small.
Look for beef that's just the right size at just the right price.

4 Hunt for bargains.
Watch the weekly paper for coupons and deals.

5 Ask for help.
Talk to your neighborhood butcher or meat counter clerk.

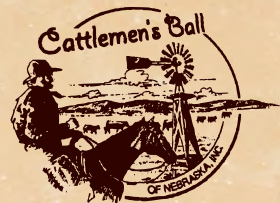

Connecting rural and urban America by sharing the positive story of production agriculture has been the mission of Trent Loos since he walked into a radio station in Spearfish, South Dakota in 2009 and asked to do his own program. That dream of this sixth generation United States farmer, often touted as an agriculture activist, came true on January 8, 2001 when *Loos Tales* aired on radio station KMZU in Missouri. Today, 3 million listeners on nearly 100 radio stations in 19 states hear the show every day, along with many who listen online worldwide. In addition to *Loos Tales*, Trent hosts and produces a daily, one-hour radio program entitled *Rural Route, Beer Proof*, as well as *Loos Trails and Tales*, *Dakota Trails and Tales*, and *Colorado Trails and Tales*, which are all available at www.FacesofAg.com. A blog of his daily adventures can be found at www.loostales.blogspot.com.

Trent travels the country to unearth stories about people involved in the many different facets of production agriculture, and to spread the good word about food producers in the United States. Trent shares his passion for an industry he truly believes in and encourages producers to stand up and proudly tell consumers about life on their operations. He utilizes modern technologies to share his experiences abroad and to “spread the good word” about this age-old industry to his radio and web audiences. Somebody needed to speak on behalf of the hard-working farmers and ranchers of America and Trent accepted the challenge. In 2008, Trent was recognized by West Quest as the “Voice of Rural America.”

Faces of Agriculture, a non-profit organization, was founded in 2003 by Trent, his wife Kelli, and a small group of livestock producers who were motivated to convince consumers that the abundant supply of safe, healthy food eaten in this country is produced by real people on farms, not created in factories. Trent and Kelli enjoy life in central Nebraska with their three daughters. Cattle, hogs, horses, and meat goats keep them plenty busy on the farm. The family is constantly on the go, sharing adventures in training and riding horses, youth sports, 4-H, archery, and road trips. Some of their favorite memories are created around the fire pit with friends and family they’ve welcomed from far and wide.

Montgomery Gentry

When the two Kentucky boys—Eddie is from Lancaster and Troy is from Lexington—first busted onto the national scene in 1999 with the defiant “Hillbilly Shoes,” notice was served—country music had never seen a hard-driving duo like this.

Despite the millions of albums sold, the sold out shows, and the scores of awards, Montgomery Gentry remains in touch with its working class roots. “We are blue collar workers and we lived the songs that we sing,” says Troy, “Because of that, our fans are able to make the connection, and when they hear our songs, they know we are singing with passion, and we know what we are talking about.”

“People are going to be able to touch on each one of our songs and say, ‘Yeah man, that song is a little bit about me,’ or ‘I know a person who lives next door to me and has been through what you just got done singing about,’” Troy continues. “People can associate themselves with our songs.”

“With us, what you see is what you get,” Eddie says of the duo’s down-to-earth demeanor. “We don’t act like we don’t drink or cuss. We have faults like everybody else and that’s who we are.”

Who they are is a duo with fourteen Top 10 singles, including five No. 1s: “Something To Be Proud Of,” “If You Ever Stop Loving Me,” “Lucky Man,” “Back When I Knew It All,” and “Roll With Me.”

But awards and accolades aside, it’s Eddie and Troy’s induction into the venerable Grand Ole Opry in 2009 that means the most to them.

“Unlike other awards, becoming members of the Grand Ole Opry is something people can’t take away from you,” Troy says. “Other awards come and go, but once you become a member of the Opry, you are a member for life—that’s something that Eddie and I are very proud to be a part of.”

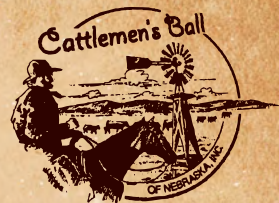
There’s no doubt that they’re hard-running honky tonkers, but Eddie and Troy are also empathetic citizens of the world. Acknowledged by the Academy of Country Music as the 2010 winners of its Humanitarian Award, they devote their time and energy to making the needs of others



a priority. They are active participants in many charitable organizations, including the U.S. Military and numerous charitable organizations such as the TJ Martell Foundation, Camp Horsin’ Around, and the Make-A-Wish Foundation of Middle Tennessee, among numerous others.

Make no mistake about it: Montgomery Gentry has secured a place in music history with a unique blend of country, southern rock, and Everly Brothers-like harmonies combined with relatable lyrics.

“We grew up on Charlie Daniels, Waylon Jennings, Willie Nelson, Lynyrd Skynyrd, and Merle Haggard,” Eddie says with conviction. “That’s who we are. We cut our teeth in the honky tonks and no matter what we try to do, we have to be us or it just doesn’t sound right.”

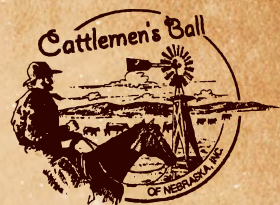
