

WHAT IS YOUR

WHAT IS YOUR RELATIONSHIP WITH THE CATTLEMEN'S BALL OF NEBRASKA?

The Cattlemen's Ball was started in 1998 as a fundraiser for the Cancer Center, which was then known as the Eppley Cancer Center and the name changed to the Fred & Pamela Buffett Cancer Center in 2015. The Cattlemen's Ball has provided tremendous support for cancer research leading to advances in cancer treatment and prevention in Nebraska.

HOW MANY CATTLEMEN'S BALLS HAVE YOU ATTENDED?

I have attended every Cattlemen's Ball except the one in 1998. I arrived as the Director of the Eppley Cancer Center on August 1, 1999, but my entire family – (my wife Dr. Alison Freifeld, Director of Infectious Disease for Oncology at UNMC and my two daughters who were 9 and 12 at the time), flew out from Maryland to attend our first Cattlemen's Ball in June 1999 hosted by Dr. Joe and Diane Jeffery in Lexington, NE (two months before we moved to Nebraska).

WHICH BALL STICKS OUT THE MOST, AND WHY?

Every Cattlemen's Ball has been great, all held on beautiful ranches all across Nebraska. I always enjoy seeing the beauty of the sandhills and the Wild Cat Canyons in Banner County are very special.

Also, the commitment of the host families to host the Ball: the Holz-fasters getting Union Pacific to run a train out to the Ball at Paxton, and there were torrential rain and hail storms at a few of the Cattlemen's Balls, but the events and the shows still went on. It's also great to see all the host families and volunteers from previous Cattlemen's Balls coming to the event each year.

WHAT'S YOUR FAVORITE CATTLEMEN'S BALL MEMORY?

One memory that stands out was early on, when a family donated two horses to the auction at a Cattlemen's Ball. The two horses had belonged to their daughter who had recently died of melanoma. The person who had the highest bid (\$25,000) just told the auctioneer to rebid the horses. This went on two more times before the horses were finally

sold. I was subsequently told that several ranchers had worked together to make sure that amount raised by the sale of the two

> horses would honor the family, and that the horses could then go to deserving families with young children. This was one of many memories that I have from the Cattlemen's Ball highlighting the generosity of Nebraskans.

FAVORITE CUT OF BEEF? All beef is great— but I especially MHAT DO YOU SEE AS THE NEXT/LATEST BREAKTHROUGH IN CANCER RESEARCH AT THE BUFFETT CANCER CENTER?

The future of cancer treatment and prevention is Precision Medicine: using genomic data (DNA sequencing) from each person's cancer to develop a specific treatment plan specially designed to treat their cancer, and the advanc-

es of immunotherapy to turn on a patient's immune system to target the genetic changes in their cancer.

The next big project is advancing Precision Medicine and immunotherapy for cancer treatment and advancing access to clinical trials across the state.

WHAT HAVE YOU LEARNED FROM OR SURPRISED YOU MOST ABOUT CATTLEMEN'S BALL VOLUNTEERS?

How many volunteers it takes to put on a Cattlemen's Ball, and how much time they devouts each year to its success.

In his twenty-five plus year career, Tracy Byrd has charted more than thirty hit singles, including eleven Top Ten hits like, "Big Love," "I'm From the Country," "Ten Rounds With Jose Cuervo," and a crowd favorite sing along song, "Drinkin' Bone". He has performed for over 4,000 crowds, entertaining country music fans from the United States, Canada, Mexico, Europe, and Australia.

The Country Troubadour, songwriter, and hitmaker, is also a well known outdoorsman. Byrd hosted TNN Outdoors Weekend Outdoor Broadcast for three years and now resides in his home state of Texas. Says Byrd, "These day's my life has great balance, with my music being a part of it, not all of it. I can honestly say I have never enjoyed it more!"



VCC BOYS: VETERANS CONSERVATION CORPS OF PLATTE COUNTY - RANDY PERAULT

During the Great Depression and Dust Bowl, a camp was established in Platte County to provide employment for military veterans. The focus of their work was a variety of soil conservation methods to benefit area farmers. Join Columbus resident Randy Perault in learning about the history of the Camp, the men who lived and worked there, and the soil conservation work they performed. This presentation will include pictures of the original Camp, what it looks today, and different projects they worked on around Platte County.

BUFFALO BILL CODY'S WILD WEST SHOW - TOM "BUFFALO TOM" MARTENS

Did you know that the very first rehearsal for Buffalo Bill Cody's Wild West Show happened in Columbus, Nebraska? Come find out where that rehearsal took place and how Buffalo Tom Martens discovered this tidbit, with the help of Keith Bryan. Tom will display aerial photos, maps, and memorabilia of Buffalo Bill Cody.

LOUP POWER DISTRICT

Nebraska's first public power district is located in Columbus. Loup Power District will explain how, in the midst of the Great Depression, leaders from Columbus had a vision for harnessing the Loup River into a power canal. The story of the canal and hydroelectric plant construction, built more than 85 years ago, will be on display. Not only was Loup Power District the beginning of public power in Nebraska, it can also be considered the grandfather of Nebraska Public Power District and Cornhusker Public Power.

CENTER PIVOT IRRIGATION

In 1949, Columbus native, Frank Zybach, applied for a patent on his "Zybach Self-Propelled Sprinkling Apparatus." A few years later, Paul Zimmerer and his two sons set up a farm equipment repair business in Lindsay, Nebraska. The two operations evolved into what is now known as Lindsay Manufacturing which will proudly display the evolution of irrigation in the Columbus area.

BEHLEN MANUFACTURING

Now a global leader in steel fabrication, Behlen Manufacturing had a humble beginning

in the Columbus garage of Walter Behlen in 1936. The first products made were steel toe caps for work shoes and clamps for wooden egg crates. The company quickly gained a reputation for innovative, quality farm products, and in 1950, Behlen broadened the company's focus and expanded its production, offering grain bins and dryers, as well as a self-framing building system known as S-Span. In 1969, Behlen was sold to the Wickes Corporation, and in 1984, a management buy-out returned the company to the local ownership that is still in place today, more than 80 years later.

Nebraska Bush Pullers was started in 1981. It continues to grow with over 100 Nebraska members from all over the Midwest. From the awesome spectacle of the multi-engine modified tractors to the wild and crazy unlimited super stock tractors, we have something for everyone.

The goal of tractor pulling is to determine the strongest machine and the best driver. Different than every other motorsport in the world, it is not about the speed, but distance pulled. The pulling track is a minimum of 30 feet wide by 320 feet long. Tractor pulling is a competitive motor sport in which modified farm tractors, modified tractors or trucks drag a metal sled along a prescribed course.

The sled contains a box filled with weight that is mechanically winched forward as the sled progresses along the course. Pulling this ever-increasing load eventually causes the vehicle to lose forward momentum and torque, although a rare few might indeed reach the end of the course, known as a "full pull." The distance from start to finish is measured in thousandths of an inch and the tractor that pulls the sled the farthest distance is declared the winner. If more than one competitor reaches the full pull mark, a pull-off is held to determine a winner.



CALF FOR A CURE

The "Calf-For-A-Cure" program invites and encourages any and all Nebraskans, regardless of their involvement in the beef industry, to take part in fundraising efforts exclusively supporting cancer research. A donation of \$1,000 buys a feeder calf, this will be combined with other donors to purchase a pen(s) of feeder cattle. A donation of \$600 pays to feed that feeder calf. Because the group values the investments being made in this program, the cattle are price-protected and

insured. Donors who purchased a calf are recognized in the official Cattlemen's Ball of Nebraska program and receive a special lanyard to wear during the 2021 Ball event.

The 2020-2021 Cattlemen's Ball Calf-For-A-Cure chairs were Jim Klug and Justin Sindelar. In September of 2019, 198 head of cattle were purchased from Tobey Watt of Abilene, KS and placed on feed at Cedar Hill Cattle Co near Howells until they were shipped for harvest in April of 2020. With the volatility of the cattle market, the committee decided to forgo purchasing cattle in the fall of 2020 and collected donations instead.
