The Cattlemen's Ball of Nebraska is a charity whose mission is to raise money for cancer research through an annual fundraising event.



The money raised at the Ball is used for cancer research at the Fred & Pamela Buffett Cancer Center in Omaha. Since the inaugural event in 1998, the Cattlemen's Ball has raised more than \$16 million to fund cancer research. Ninety percent of the proceeds go to the Cancer Center and the remaining 10% is returned to the local community for health and wellness initiatives.



The Ball is held in a different location each year, giving Nebraska communities the opportunity to showcase their unique area of the state.



The event also promotes beef, one of the state's largest industries, as part of a healthy diet.

Welcome to the 2022 Nebraska Cattlemen's Ball!

The Cattlemen's Ball brings together leaders from across the state to celebrate livestock agriculture, unite in the fight against cancer, and enjoy the natural beauty of Nebraska.

Nebraska is known as the Beef State, and for good reason. We rank first in the nation for commercial cattle slaughter, and second in cattle on feed, all cattle and calves, beef exports, and commercial red meat production. Beef is our state's #1 business in our #1 industry. Annually, Nebraska beef generates \$10 billion in cash receipts.


We've amassed a global reputation for our premium beef. Our state is the leading exporter of U.S. beef to the European Union, South Korea, Colombia, Israel, and Kuwait. And our reach continues to grow. In 2021, Nebraska exported a record \$1.81 billion of beef, which surpassed the state's previous annual high by 25%!

This year's Cattlemen's Ball highlights rural areas near our biggest cities. It's a reminder of the profound impact beef production has on all of Nebraska. Jobs in our cattle industry aren't tied to a ranch or feedlot. They're present in IT, accounting, legal, and many other professions located in Lincoln and Omaha.

From Ogallala to Omaha, the livestock industry is a prominent part of our state's history and culture. 150 years ago, Ogallala was an important center of the cattle industry. Cowboys drove their herds there, either to load them onto Union Pacific trains headed east or to rest before continuing on to the west. In the early-to-mid 20th century, Union Stockyards in Omaha was the second-largest in the world—a major hub for our nation's booming cattle industry. Today, rodeos, fairs, and butcher shops throughout Nebraska carry on this rich heritage. Our state's agricultural heritage includes responsible stewardship of the natural environment. Nebraska's farmers and ranchers are the original conservationists. Since the 1960s, our ranchers have contributed to a 66% increase in national beef production, while helping the U.S. beef industry reduce its carbon footprint by 40%. America now produces 18% of the world's beef with just 6% of the world's cattle. Our family ranchers take great care of their land and water so that they can pass it on to the next generation.

While the Cattlemen's Ball celebrates beef production, it also displays the open-hearted generosity of our ag community. Since 1998, the Cattlemen's Ball has raised nearly \$16 million to fund cancer research. Working together, we canand will-find a cure for this horrible disease. Thank you for supporting this charitable effort. Each and every one of you are part of funding a cure for cancer. I first attended the Cattlemen's Ball in 2006, and I'm always impressed by the gracious hospitality of its hosts. A special thank you to the Rathe and Lubben families for spearheading this year's event in Weeping Water. Cass County Historical Society - Plattsmouth



Weeping Water has been known as the center of Nebraska's limestone industry since the 1860s, and Nutrien has played a part in that history.

You'll also find displays by the Murdock Historical Society Museum, the Strategic Air Command and Aerospace Museum located near Ashland, Nehawka historian Susan Rice, Avoca historian Cindy Drake, the Nebraska State Historical Society Foundation, Weeping Water Whiz Kidz 4H, and more.
